The Committee held several meetings during the period under review.

As a preliminary to its work the Committee drew up a list of minimum weights of the various species of fishes which it was intented to record and also sets of rules of procedure for the verification of claims. These lists or rules were published in Stream and Field in Ireland (Vol. 7. No. 3. January 1956. p.p. 23-24) and circulated to interested parties. The Committee then examined the existing records of specimen fish and a list of verified records was drawn up, which was subsequently published in several numbers of Stream and Field in Ireland (Vol. 7. No. 3-6, January-April, 1956). In this list, reference was made to a ruid weighing 6; lbs. said to have been taken in Lough Gowna in July 1951. The Committee considers that this fish was probably a rudd/bream hybrid, and therefore should not have been included in the records for rudd.

The main work of the Committee subsequently, was the recording of recent captures of specimen fishes taken by fair angling in Irish waters. The following records were accepted by the Committee:-

/s anglers are award, there has been considerable discussion as to the identity of sharks which formerly were believed to be perbeagle sharks. Mr. Hichael Kennedy has now produced evidence from which Dr. O'bonel Browne's 365 lb. shark taken off Achill in 1932 can definitely be identified as a perbeagle shark. A paper on the occurrence of the perbeagle shark in Irish waters by Mr. Kennedy has been accepted for publication by the Irish Maturalists' Journal and will appear early in 1957.

The Committee are instrumental in arranging for the setting up of the fine skate weighing 205 lbs. taken by Mr. flexander W. Bowie at Kinsele on 26th August, 1956, and wishes to express its appreciation of the offer of the Director of the National Museum, Dublin, to display this specimen when its mounting is completed. The thanks of the Committee are due to Bord Failte Eircann which has kindly agreed to neet the expense of mounting this specimen.
