No new Irish Records were established during 1974. The following fish, however, are worthy of special mention:-

#### (1) TENCH

7 lb, 13 oz. caught by Leonard J. Gooding, 18 Orchard Road, Collier Row, Romford, Essex, England, in the River Shannon at Lanesboro, on 31st May. This is the second biggest Tench recorded by the Committee.

#### (2) LAKE TROUT

19 lb. 42 oz., caught by Tom Chartres. Bellisle. Lisbellew. Co. Fermanagh, in Lower Lough Erne, on 6th April This is the third biggest Lake Trout recorded by the Committee.

### (3) POLLACK

17 lb. 6 oz., caught by B. Souster, 72 Craven Gardens, Barkingside, Redbridge, Ilford, Essex, England, at Kinsale, Co. Cork, on 26th September. This is the joint third biggest Pollack recorded by the Committee.

#### (4) STING RAY

46 lbs., caught by Thomas Burns, 39 St. Thomas Road, South Circular Road, Dublin 8, on Morris Castle Beach, on 17th August. This is the third biggest Sting Ray recorded by the Committee.

### UNDULATE RAY

16 lb 62 oz., caught by Alec Sadler, 8 Salisbury Avenue, Stanford-Le-Hope, Essex, England, at Fenit, Co. Kerry, on 8th June. This is the third biggest Undulate Ray recorded by the Committee.

#### (6) SUNFISH

378 lbs., caught by Heinrich Koppe, 432 Weiset, 44 Iscnstasse St., West Germany, in Gallway Bay, on 3rd September. There is no category for this species, but as it is the heaviest marine fish to date taken on rod and line in Irish waters it is worthy of mention.

#### FISH OF A LIFETIME AWARD

This award is being made in respect of a Tench weighing 7 lb. 13 oz., taken on the River Shannon at Lanesboro, County Longford, on 31st May, 1974, by Leonard J. Gooding, 18 Orchard Road, Collier Row, Romford, Essex, England. This fish is only 1 oz. under he Irish Record.

The special award donated by Dr. A. E. J. Went for the best specimen taken by a juvenile, who has not reached his or her, fourteenth birthday on 1st January, 1975, was won by Sean R. Riordan, 2 Greenwood Close, Aughton, Ormskirk, Lancs., England, who caught a Garfish weighling 2 lb. 8 oz., at Kinsale, County Cork, on 29th August, 1974.

This will be an annual award, and a copy the Birth Certificate should accompany

any eligible claims.

#### REVISED SPECIMEN WEIGHTS

For the year 1975 and onwards, the Committee has decided to increase the qualifying weight for Garfish from 2 lbs to 24 lbs.

#### IDENTIFICATION

In future, where a claim is made in respect of Angler Fish it is essential that the actual fish be forwarded to the Committee for identification purposes.

#### REJECTED CLAIMS

As in every year since its inception, the Committee, with considerable regret, has had to reject a number of claims because of incomplete or inadequate documentation.

These included instances where fish were weighed on balances which were not, or could not, be checked for accuracy. Some photographs submitted as evidence of identity of species of fish were inadequate for identification purposes because they were out of focus, or obscured by spectators or were taken at such an angle that the important diagnostic features could not be certified. Some claims were also rejected because the actual fish, or its scales (where required under the rules) were not sent to the Committee's Biologists for identification, or if the fish was sent, it was in such a state of advance decomposition as to render positive identification impossible. In some cases the fish were not delivered at all but were destroyed by the Postal Authorities.

Fish must not be sent before Bank Holidays or week-ends. If they cannot reach the Committee before Friday afternoon, then they should be kept in cold store until Monday. Fish must not be wrapped in aluminium foil or polythene bags, as this hastens decomposition. They should first be wrapped in greasproof paper and then in newspaper and brown paper. Please also attach a label to each fish giving the captor's name and address. date and place of capture and the weight of the fish.

Where photographs are requested as proof of identification, it is essential that these be sharp, clear and close-up showing the entire fish with its fins and other features easily seen. They must not be foreshortened or obscured by shadows or bystanders.

#### PRESENTATION OF AWARDS

The Committee wishes to thank all those who co-operated in submitting claims during 1974. The annual Presentation of Awards to anglers whose claims had been accepted during 1973 was made in the Burlington Hotel, Dublin. It is the intention of the Committee to present its awards for the 1974 season in the Burlington Hotel, Dublin, on Saturday, 22nd February, at 3 p.m. All Irish anglers who are due awards are cordially invited to attend. Presentations were held in London and Birmingham for British anylers who had qualified for Record and Specimen Awards during 1973, and in Amsterdam for anglers from the Netherlands, and in Bonn for anglers from West Germany. Our grateful thanks are due to Bord Failte Eireann for making these Presentations possible.

# Notes on some Specimen Cartilaginous Fishes

Bu ARTHUR E. J. WENT, D.Sc.

As part of a policy to provide as much information as possible to anglers on specimen lish taken in Irish waters in the year 1971 the Committee decided to review the results obtained with regard to various species and in the annual reports for 1971, 1972 and 1973 short accounts were published as follows:--

- (a) Report for 1971. "Some notes on specimen brown trout from Irish waters."(b) Report for 1972. "Skates and rays" and "Rudd."
- (c) Report for 1973. "Ireland's record and specimen sea trout."

As a continuation of this policy the present paper on certain elasmobranch or cartilazinous fishes of importance to anglers in Ireland is published.

Since its establishment in 1955 the Irish Specimen Fish Committee has recorded the capture of many notable examples of elasmobranch species and this report is intended to indicate the information available as to five species, namely the spur dogfish and greater spotted dogfish, sometimes called the bull huss, tope, monkfish and blue shark, consideration of the remaining elasmobranch species being deferred until another year.

At first the Committee had to be guided in selecting a specimen weight by the rather meagre information as to the sizes the various species reach. Originally the specimen weight for spur dogfish (Squalus acanthias) was fixed at 10 lb (4.54 kg) but from 1962 onwards it was raised to 12 lb (5.45 kg). Similarly the specimen weight for the greater spotted dogfish (Sculiorhinus stellaris) was fixed at 14 lb (6.36 kg) and it was raised in 1962 to 16 lb (7.26 kg). The tope (Galeorhinus galeus) specimen weight was originally fixed at 40 lb (18.2 kg) at which it still remains. Specimen weights for the blue shark (Prionace glauca) have varied over the period 1955 to 1973. At first fixed at 80 lb (36.3 kg) it was raised to 100 lb (45.4 kg) in 1962, reduced to 90 lb (40.9 kg) in 1964 and raised again in 1966 to 100 lb at which level it still remains. Incidentally the record for the lesser spotted doefish (Sculiorhinus caniculus) is still open but the specimen weight has been fixed at 7 lb. (3.18 kg). The existing records (as at 31st December, 1974) for these five species are:-

Spur dogfish. 16 lb 4 oz. (7.38 kg), Strangford Lough, 20 June, 1969. Captor, C. McIvor. Greater spotted doefish. 20 lb. 4 oz. (9.20 kg). Dunmore East, 29 July, 1973. Claptor, James Monaghan,

Tope, 60 lb. 12 oz. (27.6 kg), Strangford Lough, 12 September, 1968. Captor, C. McIvor. Monkfish, 69 lb. (31.3 kg), Clew Bay, 1 July, 1958. Captor, M. Fuchs. Blue Shark. 206 lb (93.6 kg), Achill, 7 October, 1959. Captor, J. McMonagle.

In this paper only the fish of the present specimen weights will be considered. In Tables 2, 4, 6, 8 and 10 the localities have been arranged "clockwise" from Dublin around the Irish coasts.

#### SPUR DOGFISH




FIG. 1.—Size distribution of A: Specimen spur dogfish weighing 12 lb and upwards, and B: Specimen greater spotted dogfish weighing 16 lb and upwards.

The annual numbers of spur dogfish weighing 12 lb or 5.45 kg (the present specimen weight) and upwards authenticated from 1959 to 1973 are indicated in Table 1, together with the details of the heaviest fish landed in each year and its place of capture. Starting at 13 lb 6½ oz (6.08 kg) in 1959 the record rose to 14 lb (6.36 kg) in 1962, to 15 lb (6.80 kg) in 1964, to 15 lb. 12 oz (7.15 kg) in 1967 and to 16 lb 4 oz (7.38 kg) in 1969, at which it still remains. The places of capture of specimen spur doglish are indicated in Table 2, together with the local record. Specimen spur dogfish are widely distributed almost around the whole of the Inish coasts, although some localities, such as Dungarvan Bay, Kenmare Bay, Valentia and Strangford Lough accounted for a high propontion of the specimens. The size distribution in half pound groups is indicated in Fig. 1A.

#### GREATER SPOTTED DOGFISH

The annual numbers of greater spotted dogfish of 16 lb (7.26 kg) and upwards (the present specimen weight) are indicated in Table 3, together with details of the heaviest fish landed in each year and its place of capture. Starting at 17 lb 13 oz (8.08 kg) in 1959 the record rose to 18 lb 6 oz (8.34 kg) in 1960, to 18 lb 13½ oz (8.57 kg) in 1961, to 19 lb 4 oz (8.74 kg) in 1962, to 19 lb 8 oz (8.86 kg) in 1966, to 19 lb 12 oz (8.97 kg) in 1969 and to 20 lb 4 oz (9.20 kg) in 1973, at which it still remains. The places of capture of specimen greater spotted dogfish are indicated in Table 4, together with the local record. Greater spotted dogfish have been caught around all the coasts of Ireland, except the extreme north (Counties Derny and Antrim). The size distribution in half pound groups is indicated in Fig. 1B.


The annual numbers of specimen tope authenticated from 1959 to 1973 are indicated in Fable 5, together with details of the heaviest fish landed in each year and its place of apture. The Irish record was 56 lb (25.4 kg) in 1955 (this fish was caught before the Committee was established), it rose to 60 lb (27.2 kg) in 1961 and to 60 lb 12 oz (27.6 kg) n 1968, at which figure it still remains. The places of capture of specimen tope are given n Table 6, together with the local record. Specimen tope have been caught from Strangford cough around the coasts to Lough Swilly, the former locality contributing 14, out of a otal of 72 specimens, recorded by the Committee to date. The size distribution (in 2 bound groups) of the specimen tope are indicated in Fig. 2A.

MONKFISH

The number of specimen monkfish authenticated in the different years are given in Table 7, together with the heaviest fish landed in each year and its place of capture. The Irish record monkfish weighing 69 lb (31.3 kg) was taken early in the Committee's existence in 1958 and this had not been broken by 1974. Only six places provided specimen monkfish, as will be seen from Table 8, and even then 93 per cent were taken at two localities, namely Fenit and Clew Bay. The size distribution of the specimen fish in two-pound groups is given in Fig. 2B.

#### BLUE SHARK




FIG. 3.—Size distribution of specimen blue sharks in ten-pound groups.

The annual numbers of blue shark of 100 lb (45.6 kg) the present specimen limit, or over are given in Table 9, together with the heaviest fish of each year and its place of capture. The specimen weight originally fixed by the Committee for this species was 80 lb (36.3 kg). The record accepted by the Committee in 1955 was 122 lb (55.4 kg) but this was soon broken in 1959 by a fish of 206 lb (93.5 kg) from Achill, as indicated earlier. Unlike the other species referred to in this paper the difference between the record weight and the next contender for the title at 163 lb (74.0 kg) is relatively large. This is well illustrated in Fig. 3. The places of capture of specimen blue shark range mainly along the south coast of Ireland from Helvick to Valentia only four specimens, including the record having been captured outside that area (Table 10). Kinsale, with 173 specimens, was responsible for almost exactly two-thirds of the total, with Dungarvan second with 33 specimens or about 13 per cent.
