FISH OF A LIFETIME AWARD

This award is being made for:-

(1) A TURBOT weighing 28 lbs. caught on the Turbot Bank in Cork Harbour by Bill Stuart. Carrig View, Monkstown, Co. Cork, on 1st September, 1980. This fish broke the Irish Record which had stood since 1915 only to be beaten five days later by the new Irish Record.

2) A RIVER PIKE weighing 41 lbs. caught by Alan Underhill, Thorn Tree Inn, Gibbet Street, Halifax, Yorks, England, at Athleague on the River Suck, Co. Galway, on 22nd May, 1980.

SPECIAL AWARD FOR JUVENILES

Each year Dr. A. E. J. Went donates a special award for the best specimen taken by a juvenile, who has not reached his or her fourteenth birthday on 1st January, 1981. Two fish were very close in merit and in the circumstances, Dr. Went has decided to make two awards this year. They go to:—

Nigel Adair, 12 Heronshaw, Bushmills, Co. Antrim, for a Ballan Wrasse weighing 6 lbs. 2 ozs. taken at Port Ballintrae on August 26th, 1980.

REVISED SPECIMEN WEIGHTS

For the 1981 season onwards, the Committee has decided to increase the specimen weight for Rudd/ Bream Hybrid from 3 lbs. to 3 lbs. 8 ozs. Due to the large number of specimen Rudd/Bream Hybrids recorded during 1980, pressure of space does not permit us to list all the accepted claims. All anglers who had specimens accepted are mentioned in the list but where an angler caught a number of fish weighing both above and below the new specimen weight, those fish weighing under 3 lbs. 8 ozs. are not listed in the Report.

NEW CATEGORIES

A number of species which are considered rare have been occurring in angler's catches with some regularity. While there are no categories as yet for these species, the Committee would welcome claims from anglers for the following: (1) Smooth Hound (Mustelus sp.); (2) Torsk (Brosme brosme); 3) Three Bearded Rockling (Gaidropsarus vulgaris): (4) Black Sea Bream (Spondyliosoma

In the case of all the above species, the actual body of the fish should be sent to the Committee for examination.

METRIFICATION

As and from 1978 the schedule of specimen weights on the Specimen Fish Claim Form has given the weight in lbs, and ozs, and also in kilos and grammes. Claims will be accepted under either system until we eventually go metric altogether. As many weighing scales also weigh in decimals instead of lb. and ozs, claims are also accepted in lb. and decimals of lb.

COMMON SKATE

In the interest of conservation of the species, the Committee during 1976 decided to remove the Common Skate (Raja batis) from the list of eligible fishes for three years, i.e. 1977/1979, and not to consider any claims whatsoever, except a possible new record (i.e. a fish weighing in excess of 221 lbs.) during the three-year period. The Committee has been delighted with the response to its appeal and it is gratifying to know that in most angling centres throughout the country. common skate are returned unharmed to the water. The situation came up for review at the Committee's final meeting for the year and it was decided to extend the ban for a further three-year period at the end of which it is hoped that the position will have further improved. The Committee in the meantime will keep the situation under annual review and looks forward to the continued co-operation of anglers in the conservation of the species.

"SETTING UP" CLASSES

The Committee would like to get together a national collection of exceptionally big fish, and so, in the case of fish of or above the weights listed below, if the angler so wishes, the Committee will accept the fish for setting up as part of such national collection. Where a fish of marketable species is accepted by the Committee for setting up, the market value of the fish will be paid to the donor, if requested. Freight charges will also be paid by the Committee.

The following is a list of species (with minimum weights) which the Committee would like to

receive for "setting up":-

FUND RAISING

A list of those who contributed so generously to the funds of the Committee is given at the end of this Report but we feel that special mention must be given to two special fund raising efforts made on our behalf. Four voung boys. Ciaran Coughlan, Jim O'Connell and brothers Gerard and Philip Casey, all members of the Shannonbridge Anglers Association (Co. Offaly) assisted by the Hon. Secretary of the Shannonbridge A. A. Dermot Killeen, held a 48 hour "non stop" sponsored fishing exercise in the River Shannon at Shannonbridge and collected a sum of £135 on our behalf.

The South Shore S.A.C. (Dublin) organised and ran a special open shore competition in aid of the Committee at Kilcole, Co. Wicklow on June 13th. The proceeds which came to £120 were donated to the Committee.

These were the first efforts made by anglers to raise funds in this manner on our behalf and the Committee extends its grateful thanks to all those who assisted and gave so generously of their time.

REJECTED CLAIMS

As in every year since its inception, the Committee with considerable regret, has had to reject a number of claims because of incomplete or inadequate documentation.

These included instances where fish were weighed on balances which were not, or could not, be checked for accuracy. Some photographs submitted as evidence of identity of species of fish were nadequate for identification purposes because they were out of focus, or obscured by spectators or were taken at such an angle that the important diagnostic features could not be certified. Some claims were also rejected because the actual fish, or its scales (where required under the rules) were not sent to the Committee's Biologists for identification, or if the fish was sent, it was in such a state of advanced decomposition as to render positive identification impossible. In some cases the fish were not delivered at all but were destroyed by the Postal Authorities.

Fish must not be sent before Bank Holidays or week-ends. If they cannot reach the Committee before Friday afternoon, then they should be kept in cold storage until Monday. Fish must not be wrapped in aluminium foil or polythene bags, as this hastens decomposition. They should first be wrapped in greaseproof paper and then in newspaper and brown paper. Please also attach a label to each fish giving the captor's name and address, date and place of capture and the weight of the fish.

Where photographs are requested as proof of identification, it is essential that these be sharp, clear and close-up, showing the entire fish with its fins and other features easily seen. They must not be foreshortened or obscured by shadows or bystanders. (See Rules on Claim Form.)

PRESENTATION OF AWARDS

IN IRELAND

The Annual Presentation of Awards to anglers whose claims were accepted during 1979 was made at the Burlington Hotel, Dublin. The Presentation for the 1980 awards will take place at the Burlington Hotel Dublin at 3.00 p.m. on 28th February 1981. All Irish anglers who are due awards are cordially invited to attend.

ABROAD

Presentations were held for British anglers who were due awards for 1979 in London, Bolton, Leeds, Leicester and Birmingham. It is hoped that similar presentations will be held early in 1981 and award winners will receive invitations.

Presentations were also held in Rotterdam for anglers from the Netherlands during 1980 and it is hoped to make presentations to Continental anglers at suitable centres during 1981.

Our grateful thanks are due to Bord Failte Eireann (Irish Tourist Board) for making these presentations possible and to Aer Lingus (Irish Airlines) and B & I (British & Irish Steampacket Co. Ltd.) for their assistance during the year.

ACCOUNTS

A statement of the Committee's accounts for the calendar year 1979 is given in this Report. The 1980 accounts will only be available early in 1981 and will be published in the next Report.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

The transfer of the Department of Fisheries & Forestry Laboratory to Abbotstown, Co. Dublin and the fact that there are no Saturday postal deliveries in Dublin caused difficulties during the year with fish sent for identification. In future all fish for identification must be sent to the Committee at Balnagowan House, Mobhi Boreen, Mobhi Road, Glasnevin, Dublin 9. (Phone 379206). All correspondence should also be sent to this address.

Fish taken in Northern Ireland should be sent as heretofore to the Fisheries Laboratory, The Cutts, Coleraine (Phone 4521) indicating that the fish has been sent for identification on behalf of the Irish Specimen Fish Committee.

A label must be attached to each fish giving the captors name and address, date and place of capture and the weight of the fish.

In the case of the following freshwater species — Dace, Rudd, Roach, Rudd/Bream Hybrid, Roach/Bream Hybrid, where the actual body is required for identification by our biologists, it should be noted that these fishes can be presented to us alive and not necessarily dead. Many live fish are presented to the Committee at Balnagowan House for identification and arrangements made to return the fish safely to the water.

OBITUARY

As we went to press, the tragic news reached us of the sudden death of our Chairman, Dr. Arthur E. J. Went, on the 8th December, 1980. He was born in London in 1910 and came to Ireland in 1936 as Assistant Inspector of Fisheries. He was appointed Scientific Adviser and Chief Inspector of Fisheries in 1946. Dr. Went was elected to the Royal Irish Academy in 1942 and was the youngest person to gain that honour. He also served on the Science Committee of the Royal Dublin Society and on the council of the Royal Zoological Society of Ireland which he later served as President for a three year period.

His work for international fisheries through the International Council for the Exploration of the Sea (I.C.E.S.) was widely known and he was President of that body from 1968 to 1971. In Ireland he was best known for his work on Salmon fisheries. He was Scientific Adviser to the Foyle Fisheries Commission from 1957 until his retirement in 1975. He assisted in the formation of the Salmon Research Trust of Ireland in 1955, served as director of research until 1975 when he became honorary consultant and in 1977 became chairman of the Committee of Management.

He was a founder member of the Irish Specimen Fish Committee which he served faithfully since 1955. Everything he did, he did wholeheartedly and it was his proud boast that he never missed or was late for a meeting of the Committee since its inception. His death is a great loss to the many organisations he served so well and we express the Committee's sympathy and that of a host of his friends who support our Committee, to his daughter, Janice and his son, David.

RULES

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

- (1) IRISH SPECIMEN FISH COMMITTEE. This Committee consists of representatives of the Irish Angling Federations and the Government Departments and official organisations interested in angling. Its object is to verify, record and publicise the capture of large fish on rod and line in Irish waters. A list of Specimen Fish is published annually by the Committee. Only fish which can be fully vouched for as to weight and species can be accepted and listed by the Committee.
- (2) FAIR ANGLING. "Pair Angling" means any legitimate method of angling with rod and reel which is recognised as a fair and sporting method. A fish must be hooked in or in the immediate vicinity of the mouth when it has taken the bait or lure; fish which have been foul-hooked, even accidentally, are not eligible. A fish in respect of which a claim is made must be hooked, played and brought to gaff or net by the angler UN-AIDED, though the fish may be gaffed or netted by another, and it is permissible for the person using the gaff to take hold of the trace or doubled line (in the case of big game fishing) to steady the fish when it has been played out and brought within reach. Breakage of rod, reel or line, or alteration or substitution of tackle, while a fish is being played, disqualify it for claim or record purposes. A fish may not be shot, lanced, clubbed or harpooned before landing. Claims for fish caught during the statutory close season for the species (where this applies) cannot be accepted.
- (3) WEIGHING: Fish must be weighed in the presence of independent, reliable witnesses on a properly certified scales, e.g., a shop scales or an official club scales which is covered by a certificate from the local Weights and Measures Officer. Claims cannot be accepted in respect of fish weighed on uncertified scales, e.g., anglers' spring balances or in respect of fish weighed on scales inappropriate to the size of the fish, e.g., fish in the 2 to 5 lb. range weighed on balances weighing up to 100 lb. or over and graduated in large divisions. Claims cannot be accepted in the case of fish which have been weighed on board a boat.
- (4) IDENTIFICATION. The identification of a fish must be fully documented where there is a possibility of its confusion with any other (and particularly larger) species. For this reason the Committee in respect of some species insists on scales from the fish, close up photographs or the actual body as actual proof of identification before it will consider claims. Scales must be submitted in respect of claims for SALMON, SEA TROUT, BROWN TROUT (including SLOB TROUT). Any brown trout taken in tidal waters, i.e., in the sea or in an estuary below the freshwater boundary as defined for that river will be regarded for claim purposes as a slob trout. About 50 scales scraped from each shoulder of the fish should be sent with the claim.

The fish itself should be forwarded for identification to the Irish Specimen Fish Committee, Mobhi Road, Glasnevin, Dublin 9, in the case of fish taken in the Republic of Ireland, and to the Fisheries Laboratory, The Cutts, Coleraine, N.I., in the case of fish taken in Northern Ireland.

The actual body must be forwarded for identification in the case of the following species — DACE, RUDD, ROACH, RUDD BREAM HYBRID, ROACH BREAM HYBRID, MACKEREL, WRASSE, SCAD, HERRING, SHAD, FLOUNDER, DAB, BRILL, MEGRIM, GURNARDS, GREY MULLET, ANGLER FISH, LESSER SPOTTED DOGFISH, RAYS BREAM, and "RIVER" eels taken in tidal waters.

CLEAR, SHARP, CLOSE-UP PHOTOGRAPHS, showing the entire fish with its fins and other features easily seen, and not fore-shortened or obscured by shadows or by-standers, must be provided in the case of:—

TOPE, SHARKS, SKATE, RAYS, MONKFISH, POLLACK, COALFISH.

If necessary, the fish should be hung up. In the case of skates and rays, photographs of both back and belly surfaces should be provided and particulars of the colouration given (with particular reference to the presence of dark or grey spots, or streaks or patches on the belly side). Samples of the teeth should be furnished in the case of Porbeagle and Mako Sharks. In addition, there should be a clear close-up photograph showing the jaws with teeth exposed.

(5) "SETTING UP" CLASSES. The Committee would like to get together a national collection of exceptionally big fish, and so, in the case of fish of or above the weights listed below, if the angler so wishes, the Committee will accept the fish to setting up as part of such national collection. Where a fish of marketable species is accepted by the Committee for setting up, the market-value of the fish will be paid to the donor, if requested. Freight charges will also be paid by the Committee.

The following is a list of species (with minimum weights) which the Committee would

like to receive for "setting up":-

COD (40 lbs.); CONGER (70 lbs.); JOHN DORY (7 lbs.); GREY MULLET (8 lbs.); POLLACK (16 lbs.); POUTING (4 lbs.); RED SEA BREAM (7 lbs.); ALLIS SHAD (5 lbs.); TWAITE SHAD (3 lbs.); PORBEAGLE SHARK (300 lbs.); MAKO SHARK (200 lbs.); WHITING (4½ lbs.); BALLAN WRASSE (9 lbs.); CUCKOO WRASSE (1½ lbs.)

(6) SENDING FISH TO COMMITTEE:

Please

(1) Notify Committee when a fish is being sent in for identification or setting up (telephone Dublin 379206).

(2) Do not send fish on their travels before Bank Holidays or weekends; (keep in a cold store if fish cannot be delivered quickly on or before Friday afternoon).

Please attach a label to each fish forwarded for identification giving the captor's name and address, date and place of capture and the

weight of the fish.

- (4) Fish (except small examples which have been previously soaked in formalin for at least 12 hours) should not be sent in polythene bags or wrapped in aluminium foil as this causes very rapid decomposition. They should be wrapped first in greaseproof paper and then in newspaper and brown paper.
- (7) AWARDS. Anglers whose claims have been accepted by the Committee will be awarded special 'Merit Badges' in the case of Specimen Fish, and Silver Medals in the case of Record Fish. Specimen Fish Certificates will also be issued in respect of all ratified claims. Special badges are also awarded to anglers who have captured ten or more specimen fish, special medals to anglers who have caught specimens of ten different species, and special badges are issued each year for fish of exceptional merit though not of record size.
