



A SMOOTH HOUND of 13.75 lbs was caught by Peter Mooney of 62 Comeragh Road, Drimnagh, Dublin, at Five Mile Point on June 27th.

A **RUDD** of 3 lbs. 4 ozs. was caught by Steve Wilks of 14 Newtown Road, Marlow, Bucks, England, at Annaghmore Lake on May 27th.

A **GARFISH** (Belone svetovidori) of 1 lb caught by George H.M. Wyntjes (NL) at Courtmacsherry on July 26th, 1989, becomes the first recognised record of this recently introduced category.

SPECIAL AWARD FOR JUVENILES

Dr. A.E.J. Went donated a special award for the best specimen taken by a juvenile who has not reached his or her fourteenth birthday on 31st December, 1991. The award goes to: Christopter Booth of Tarmons, Waterville, Co. Kerry for a sea trout of 8.03 lbs. caught on Lough Currane on 29 June 1990.

SPECIAL AWARD

In 1976 the Committee decided to recognise the angling prowess of those anglers who have authenticated claims for specimens of 10 separate species of fish. Only 18 of these awards have been made to-date and during 1991 Maurice Laurent of Leskinfere, Gorey, Co. Wexford and Eddie Cull of Woodlands, Garryduff, Midleton, Co. Cork. qualified. Eddie Cull has the unique distinction in that all his fish have been caught while shore angling.

NEW CATEGORY

The Trigger fish (Balistes carolinensis) was considered to be one of our rarer species but its capture by anglers has been reported more frequently in recent years. The Committee has lecided to add the species to its list of eligible species at the opening weight of 3.25 lbs. A photograph of the fish should be submitted for identification purposes with all claims.

LIMITATION ON NUMBER OF CLAIMS

A maximum of three (3) awards will be made to any particular claimant for a single species in any one year. However, provision will be made that when the angler achieves his target and subsequently captures larger fish, these will be taken into account but the inal number of awards for any species in a single year will not be more than three swards. By including this latter provision, it will ensure that the anglers competitive spirit is kept up and higher achievements could still be sought.

EXCLUSION FROM SPECIMEN STATUS

Where species of fish are introduced to a fishery at or above existing specimen weights, those species from that particular fishery shall not be considered for specimen or record status.

WEIGHING OF FISH

The Committee insists that all fish be weighed on scales which are verified for accuracy. Shop scales normally used in trade are checked regularly by the Department of Weights and Measures and are acceptable for weighing specimen and record fish. Some scales not normally certified by the Weights and Measures Authority for trade can be certified by them for accuracy. Such scales if certified in advance are acceptable to the Committee for weighing purposes and the certification will be valid for one year from the date of issue of the certificate of accuracy. Scales which are not certified at the time of weighing will not be accepted nor will certification in retrospect for such scales.

METRIFICATION

As and from 1978, the schedule of specimen weights on the Specimen Fish Claims Forms has given the weight in lbs and ozs., and also in kilos and grammes. Claims will be accepted under either system until we eventually go metric altogether. As many weighing scales also weigh in decimal instead of lbs. and ozs., claims are also accepted in lbs. and decimal of lb.

COMMON SKATE

In the interest of conservation of the species, the Committee during 1976 decided to remove the Common Skate (Raja batis) from the list of eligible fishes and not to consider any claims whatsoever, except for a possible new record (i.e., a fish weighing in excess of 221 lbs.) The Committee has been delighted with the response to its appeal and it is gratifying to know that in most angling centres throughout the country, common skate are returned unharmed to the water. The situation came up for review at the Committee's final meeting for the year 1980 and it was decided to extend the ban until urther notice. The Committee in the meantime will keep the situation under annual eview and looks forward to the continued co-operation of anglers in the conservation of the species.

CAPTORS ADDRESSES

Because of difficulties in establishing eligibility for the Ten Specimen and Ten Species Awards, captors are advised to inform the Committee of any changes in their addresses.

DISTRIBUTION OF SPECIMEN AWARDS

The number of specimen fish taken by visiting anglers in recent years may be of interest for purposes of comparison. The details are listed below for:

25 Years of Fishing Holidays

For 25 years I have been visiting Southern Ireland each year for coarse and game fishing holidays. During that quarter of a century, I am happy to say that I have enjoyed better fishing than I could ever have hoped for. Furthermore, it is my intention to spend many more great holidays in Ireland as there is nowhere else I wish to go.

Being an angler who prefers to fish with simple methods and who concentrates on catching a particular species, I must say that I have been overjoyed to be able to find so many lakes that noone has ever fished before and in which I have managed to catch very good bags of fish especially bream, tench, rudd and pike.

In the early days it occasionally took a lot of personal effort as, being virgin waters, I frequently found it necessary to cut out my own swims with a long handled scythe.

I started off my Irish angling experience in July, 1966, by visiting Ballinamore in Co. Leitrim to fish for bream in Garadice Lake. I had read about it in the Angling Times and I had never before caught a bream. On arrival, I was taken but by John McAllister and shown a spot on Allerton's Shore where two English anglers had taken hundred weight catches of bream to 5 lbs only three days previously. Arming myself with two stone of flake maize from the local

store, a large tin of worms and a loaf of bread (there were no maggots available then) I went back the next day to try my luck. The weather was wet and windy. I set up my tackle and cast into 15 feet of rocky bottomed water. I hardly had time to attach a cork bite indicator onto my 4 lbs B.S. line when it went tight and I was into a good sized bream of 4.5 lbs. I took John McAllister's advice not to introduce any ground bait if the fish were on the feed, so I carried on fishing for over an hour by which time I had netted 8 or 9 hard fighting "slabs" all 4-5.5 lbs. The swim then went "dead" and only then did I throw out the ground bait - 3 or 4 cricket size balls of hard flake maize were lobbed into the area I had been catching the fish. Soon the bites came back thick and fast and after 6 hours, by which time I had run out of both hook bait and groundbait, I managed somehow to lug my bulging keepnet onto the bank to find I had caught 26 bream for a weight well over 100 lbs. This was the start of my first quarter century of Irish angling - a day I shall always remember.

Deciding to concentrate in the Co. Leitrim and West Cavan area, I returned each year to 1970 to Ballinamore where I discovered waters full of excellent bream and rudd - Coologue Lake, Ardmeenan, Keenheen, Drumcoura and Corgar to name just a few. But where were the tench the area was reported to have! Local angler and guesthouse owner, Ivan Price, advised me to look at Drumlonan Lake where he thought tench had been stocked by the Inland Fisheries Trust in the late '50's. This lake looked fairly inaccessible apart from a concrete pier in its south eastern corner, so I took a stroll across the marshy meadows on the southern side. Here I found a spot where the rushes were not too thick. I cut out a swim and raked out the weeds with my small garden rake on a long piece of rope. I baited up the swim with a moderate amount of maize and chopped worms. Next day I returned to fish and again had almost instant success - a large perch of about 1 lb. 12 ozs., followed by plenty more - all on worm bait. After giving the matter some thought, I changed to bread paste and that did the trick - tench at last. The first was a lovely 4 pounder and then they came in a steady stream for over 3 hours. 14 tench for a weight of 52 lbs all on bread paste from a "virgin swim". This lake has in recent years produced tench over the Irish Specimen Weight of 6 lbs and I wonder if my fish were among those now being caught or could they now be over the Irish Record of 7 lbs. 13 ozs?

Moving around Counties Cavan, Leitrim, Monaghan and Westmeath between 1972 and 1985, I have had some tremendous catches of fish, notably bream, tench, rudd, rudd/bream hybrids and pike from nearly every water I have fished. I well remember fishing Templeport Lake near Bawnboy in 1973 and fishing the bank in the open field below the Church. It was here that I caught my first 200 lbs plus weight of bream to 7.25 lbs. on worm and bread baits. The swim was 12 ft. deep and only 20 yards off the bank. I fished this lake extensively until 1982 and I believe I must have caught over a ton of bream from it in all, but there were no specimens except for the rudd/bream hybrids which went up to 4.5 lbs.

I shared a tremendous catch at Templeport one day in July, 1980, with a pal of mine - we took between us 98 bream and 37 hybrids for a total weight of 565 lbs, all in just over 9 hours. All fish were returned to the water immediately after taking photographs of the catch which were kept in 6 keepnets.



After 18 years fishing for bream and tench in Ireland, I still had not officially recorded a Specimen fish, so I decided in 1984 to go to Carrickmacross in Co. Monaghan to try my luck at Lough Na Glack and Monalty Lake. The Irish Specimen Fish Committee's Reports showed many specimen bream from these two lakes. Knowing that big bream and tench are not caught so easily as their smaller brethren, I was prepared for long, arduous biteless sessions and so it proved to be. I went to stay at the end of March in 1984 at Norman Haworth's guesthouse. I had heard Norman was a specialist specimen bream hunter and always passed his knowledge of swims and baits, etc., on to his guests. Lough na Glack had been little fished between 1971 and 1980 I believe due to the pollution it suffered in the earlier 1970's. Local anglers had made the lake fishable again after the long lay-off and I was taken to a swim at the deepest end of the water. The water temperature was only 400°F and because of this, I didn't fancy my chances at all. I stuck it out in the same spot for six solid days and found the big bream hard to come by. Initially I missed many bites due to "twitching", so I began to strike at the slightest movement of my indicator. On day 3, I hooked into my first specimen bream - a fish of 8 lbs. 1 oz. I caught only one more (a six pounder) that week, but I was surprised to get 18 tench between 4 and 5.5 lbs. The tench gave very fast bites and were easier to hook at long range. Subsequent trips in summer months to the Carrickmacross area gave me catches of bream and tench I shall always remember. Quality and not quantity was the order of the day at Lough na Glack, Monalty and Capragh

Lakes. My best bream weighed in at 8 lbs. 7 ozs. from Monalty and my best tench 5 lbs. 14 ozs. from Capragh Lake. My bait for these lakes in the summer time was always sweetcorn or bread paste sweetened with a suitable additive these were used to avoid eels which were a real nuisance when the water was warm. Other lakes in this area where I recorded wonderful catches of somewhat smaller fish were Ballyhoe, Corcrin and Lough Derry, although I did get a couple of 7 lbs. 14 ozs. bream from Lough Derry in 1984 - the fishing however, was much easier and I had bags up to 150 lbs on several occasions. At Ballyhoe for example, I remember an extremely wet Saturday in July, 1985, when I was catching all day long and finished up with 38 bream and 27 tench for about 200 lbs.

In 1989, I took an October trip to fish the River Inny at Finea Bridge. I found the fishing to be extremely good for roach and small bream off the wooden boat jetty below the bridge but I became tired of catching hundreds of small fish.

I met a party of German anglers so I asked one of them who spoke English if I could boat fish with him for pike on nearby Lough Kinale. He duly obliged when I gave him a bag full of small dead fish for bait. My friend for the day was called Klaus and on a wet and windy morning, we sped off to the sheltered side of L. Kinale where we fished for several hours and caught only small pike up to 9 lbs. We decided to move across the lake into a weedy bay where we had previously spotted a large pike roll on the surface. I cast to where I thought it might be lying and was in luck straight away - my float sinking away very quickly towards the weeds. I immediately bent my rod into the fish. After over 30 minutes of heart throbbing struggle, we succeeded in netting it. That pike weighed 25 lbs. 4 ozs and was by far my best ever and still is. The fish was quickly unhooked and returned unharmed to the water where I hope it is still swimming about. The Germans traditionally killed their pike but I understand that legislation has now put a stop to this practice.

The last two years of my quarter century of Irish angling has been spent down in Co. Kerry where my sister and her family now live. Not likely to visit Ireland without a fishing rod, I have enjoyed many lovely days on the salmon, sea trout and brown trout rivers and lakes of Kerry. In September, 1988, I spent a couple of days in a boat on Lough Leane, Killarney. I caught some beautiful wild brown trout to 5 lbs. 12 ozs on leaded hares ear sedge nymphs I had previously tied up. At Lough Currane off the rocks on the south shore of the lake, I hooked and landed some tremendous sea trout up to 5 lbs, all on my own Golden Olive Bumble, Claret and Blue and silver bodied badger hair varieties. I have yet to catch a Lough Currane salmon, although I have had them up to 14 lbs from the Rivers Feale and Laune on flies and spinners.

I have also had several successful days on the Central Fisheries Board stocked trout lakes in the Kerry area and in 1989 caught an 8.25 lbs rainbow trout on a size 14 gold ribbed hares ear nymph at Lough Nakirka near Killorglin. That fish fought like hell on a 4 pound leader and was yet another Irish rod bender I shall never forget.

Neither will I forget all those wonderful Irish guesthouse owners, anglers and the local people I have met over the last 25 years. They made my holidays into enjoyable and successful ones much more than the fish and I look forward to 1992 and future years.

RULES

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

- (1) IRISH SPECIMEN FISH COMMITTE: This Committee consists of representatives of the Irish Angling Federations and the Government Departments and official organisations interested in angling. Its objective is to verify, record and publicise the capture of large fish on rod and line in Irish waters. A list of Specimen Fish is published annually by the Committee. Only fish which can be fully vouched for as to weight and species can be accepted and listed by the Committee.
- (2) FAIR ANGLING: "Fair Angling" means any legitimate method of angling with rod and reel which is recognised as a fair and sporting method. A fish must be hooked in or in the immediate vicinity of the mouth when it has taken the bait or lure; fish which have been foul-hooked, even accidentally, are not eligible. A fish in respect of which a claim is made must be hooked, played and brought to gaff or net by the angler UNAIDED, though the fish may be gaffed or netted by another, and it is permissible for the person using the gaff to take hold of the trace or doubled line (in the case of big game fishing) to steady the fish when it has been played out and brought within reach. Breakage of rod, reel or line, or alteration or substitution of tackle, while a fish is being played, disqualify it for claim or record purposes. A fish may not be shot, lanced, clubbed or harpooned before landing. Claims for fish caught during the statutory close season for the species (where this applies) cannot be accepted.
- (3) WEIGHING: Fish must be weighed in the presence of independent, reliable witnesses on a properly certified scales, e.g., a shop scales or an official club scales which is covered by a certificate from the local Weights and Measures Officer. Claims cannot be accepted in respect of fish weighed on scales inappropriate to the size of the fish, e.g., fish in the 2 to 5 lb range weighed on balances weighing up to 100 lbs or over and graduated in large divisions. Claims cannot be accepted in the case of fish which has been weighed on board a boat. Please note: Weighing scales must be covered by a Certificate of Accuracy at the time of weighing. They cannot be certified in retrospect, i.e. after the fish has been weighed.
- (4) IDENTIFICATION: The identification of a fish must be fully documented where there is a possibility of its confusion with any other (and particularly larger) species. For this reason, the Committee in respect of some species insists on scales from the fish, close up photographs or the actual body as actual proof of identification before it will consider claims. Scales must be submitted in respect of claims for SALMON, SEA TROUT, BROWN TROUT (including SLOB TROUT). Any brown trout taken in tidal waters, i.e., in the sea or in an estuary below the freshwater boundary as defined for that river will be regarded for claim purposes as a slob trout. About 50 scales scraped from each shoulder of the fish should be sent with the claim. The fish itself should be forwarded for identification to the Irish Specimen Fish Committee, Mobhi Boreen, Glasnevin, Dublin 9, in the case of fish taken in the Republic of Ireland, and to the Fisheries Laboratory, The Cutts, Coleraine, N.I., in the case of fish taken in Northern Ireland. The actual body must be forwarded for identification in the case of the following species:- DACE, ROACH, RUDD/BREAM HYBRID, ROACH/BREAM HYBRID, MACKEREL, SCAD, HERRING, SHAD, FLOUNDER, DAB, BRILL, MEGRIM, GURNARDS, GREY MULLET, ANGLER FISH, LESSER SPOTTED DOGFISH, THREE BEARDED ROCKLING, SMOOTH HOUND, RAYS BREAM, "RIVER" EELS taken in tidal waters and GARFISH (head and gills only).

CLEAR, SHARP, CLOSE-UP PHOTOGRAPHS, showing the entire fish with its fins and other features easily seen, and not fore-shortened or obscured by shadows or bystanders must be provided in the case of TOPE, SHARKS, SKATE, RAY, MONKFISH, POLLACK, COALFISH, BALLAN WRASSE, TRIGGER FISH.

If necessary, the fish should be hung up. In the case of skates and rays, photographs of both back and belly surfaces should be provided and particulars of the coloration given (with particular reference to the presence of dark or grey spots, or streaks or patches on the belly side). Samples of the teeth should be furnished in the case of Porbeagle and Mako Sharks. In addition, there should be a clear close-up photograph showing the jaws and teeth exposed.

(5) LIMITATION ON NUMBER OF CLAIMS: A maximum of three (3) awards will be made to any particular claimant for a single species in any one year. However, provision will be made that when an angler achieves this target and subsequently captures larger fish, these will be taken into account but the final number of awards for any species in a single year will not be more than three awards. By including this latter provision, it will ensure that the anglers competitive spirit is kept up and higher achievements could still be sought.

(6) SENDING FISH TO THE COMMITTEE:

Please (1) Notify the Committee when a fish is being sent in for identification (Telephone Dublin 379206).

(2) Do not forward fish to the Committee before Bank Holidays or weekends; (keep in a cold store or preferably frozen if fish cannot be delivered quickly on or before Friday afternoon).

(3) Please attach a label to each fish forwarded for identification giving the captor's name and address, date and place of capture and the weight of the fish.

(4) Fish (except small examples which have been previously soaked in formalin for at least 12 hours) should not be sent in polythene bags or wrapped in aluminium foil as this causes very rapid decomposition. They should be wrapped in greaseproof paper and then in newspaper and brown paper.

(7) AWARDS: Anglers whose claims have been accepted by the Committee will be awarded special "Merit Badges" in the case of Specimen Fish and Silver Medals in the case of Record Fish. Specimen Fish Certificates will also be issued in respect of all ratified specimen fish, special medals to anglers who have captured ten or more species and special badges are issued each year for fish of exceptional merit though not of record size.
