



A CUCKOO WRASSE of 2.01 lbs was taken by John J. Tanner, Smalldean, Wendover, Bucks, England, at Carnsore Point on August 9th, 1992.

#### SPECIAL AWARD FOR JUVENILES

Dr. A.E.J. Went donated a special award for the best specimen taken by a juvenile who has not reached his or her fourteenth birthday on 31st December, 1992. The award goes to: Rene Laurent, Leskinfere, Gorey, Co. Wexford, for a pike of 29 lbs caught in the River Barrow on the 16th February, 1992.

#### SPECIAL AWARD

In 1976 the Committee decided to recognise the angling prowess of those anglers who have authenticated claims for specimens of 10 separate species of fish. Only 20 of these awards have been made to-date and during 1992 Raymond Bannerman, 24 Park Avenue, Castleknock, Dublin 15, qualified.

#### LIMITATION ON NUMBER OF CLAIMS

A maximum of three (3) awards will be made to any particular claimant for a single species in any one year. However, provision will be made that when the angler achieves this target and subsequently captures larger fish, these will be taken into account but the final number of awards for any species in a single year will not be more than three awards. By including this latter provision, it will ensure that the anglers competitive spirit is kept up and higher achievements could still be sought.

#### **EXCLUSION FROM SPECIMEN STATUS**

Where species of fish are introduced to a fishery at or above existing specimen weights, those species from that particular fishery shall not be considered for specimen or record status.

#### **WEIGHING OF FISH**

The Committee insists that all fish be weighed on scales which are verified for accuracy. Shop scales normally used in trade are checked regularly by the Department of Weights and Measures and are acceptable for weighing specimen and record fish. Some scales not normally certified by the Weights and Measures Authority for trade can be certified by them for accuracy. Such scales if certified in advance are acceptable to the Committee for weighing purposes and the certification will be valid for one year from the date of issue of the certificate of accuracy. Scales which are not certified at the time of weighing will not be accepted nor will certification in retrospect for such scales.

#### **METRIFICATION**

As and from 1978, the schedule of specimen weights on the Specimen Fish Claims Forms has given the weight in lbs and ozs., and also in kilos and grammes. Claims will be accepted under either system until we eventually go metric altogether. As many weighing scales also weigh in decimal instead of lbs. and ozs., claims are also accepted in lbs. and decimal of lb.

#### **COMMON SKATE**

In the interest of conservation of the species, the Committee during 1976 decided to remove the Common Skate (*Raja batis*) from the list of eligible fishes and not to consider any claims whatsoever, except for a possible new record (i.e., a fish weighing in excess of 221 lbs.) The Committee has been delighted with the response to its appeal and it is gratifying to know that in most angling centres throughout the country, common skate are returned unharmed to the water. The situation came up for review at the Committee's final meeting for the year 1980 and it was decided to extend the ban until further notice. The Committee in the meantime will keep the situation under annual review and looks forward to the continued co-operation of anglers in the conservation of the species.

# "The Long Wait"

T this time of year, anglers' thoughts are reflecting on thrills and tribulations of the past year's angling season and their hopes of better fishing and catches next year.

Towards the end of February, the Irish Specimen Fish Committee will be presenting its awards to anglers for specimen fish caught in 1992, in Irish waters

Many anglers ask, is it hard to catch a specimen fish? Well, if you had asked me that question 11 years ago, I would have confidentially told you that I had given up all hope of ever landing a specimen fish, and was truthfully a little paranoid about the whole subject.

My late father was the first member of our family to catch a specimen fish. The circumstances of the catch were very unusual, to say the least. My father had been prevailed upon to come along on sea fishing trips with Maurice Buckley and myself on Cork Sea Anglers' club competitions. We were fishing at Burren Pier, near Timoleague in Co. Cork, which was a great spot for flounder and bass then. Maurice and I were fishing hard but Dad had nodded off in the warm sunshine on the rocks below the pier, with his fishing rod standing to attention in his gall¢g (rod stand). Every so often as a face-saving exercise, he would condescend to reel in and clean the accumulation of weed off his tackle, re-bait and cast again before returning to his beauty sleep! Towards the end of the fishing trip, my father was reeling in what seemed like a cwt. of seaweed that had fouled his line from the strong flowing tide. When he eventually landed his weedy "catch" we raised a hollow cheer, but he had the last laugh. When the trace was eventually extricated from the mass of seaweed, hadn't he "hooked" and landed to our utter disbelief, a fine 2 lbs. 10 ozs. specimen flounder!

From that day in 1966 onwards, with his specimen fish, an Irish Specimen Fish Committee medal and certificate, and a cup presented by the Club, Cork Sea Anglers, at its Annual Dinner Dance, "Dad's army" had been well and

truly bitten by the fishing bug, in no uncertain manner. From then on, we had no peace, and were constantly being reminded that we should sharpen our hooks, wash the line, after use, polish one's spinners, etc., etc. He went on to purchase the first Ambassador 9000, Multiplier Fishing Reel, in 1969, from T.W. Murray, Tackle Stockists, Patrick Street, Cork, for the unbelievable outrageous cost of ú18.76, considered by clubmates, at that time. He was well and truly "hooked" with the fishing bug from the date of his specimen catch right up to the time of his premature death in 1972.

A perpetual trophy was presented by my mother to the Cork Sea Anglers Club in his memory, which has his specimen fish medal mounted on it. I had the pleasure of winning the trophy in 1982, for my first time, on its 10th anniversary, with the self same Ambassador 9000 reel.

I had to wait until 1971, before I came close to my first specimen fish. I won the Cork S.A.C. Club Cup with a catch of 4 bass and 1 flounder, weighing 24.5 lbs, at Owenahincha Strand in West Cork. I had won the same cup three years earlier on the nearby Warren Strand, with a catch of only one 2 lbs bass, when

storm conditions on that day had prevented any worthwhile fishing on the exposed strands. My 24.5 lbs catch included a 9 lbs. 12 oz. bass, just a mere 4 ozs. short of the magical 10 lbs specimen weight. When I gutted the bass, I discovered two whole herrings in his stomach, I have off times regretted that he had not caught that third herring!

I languished in the specimen hunting wilderness up to 11 years ago.

I was fishing in a club competition at the Old Youghal Bridge in Co. Waterford, where I was meeting scores of small flounders on a strong ebb tide. I had got a bite and was expecting another less than 12" small flounder, but low and behold, when I landed the "flattie", believe it or not, I had my first specimen flounder weighing 2 lbs. 11 ozs. At long last, I had broken my specimen hoodoo, after almost a score and ten years of angling, if I include my toirnon (stickleback) apprenticeship!

I decided the Department of Posts and Telegraphs could not be trusted with such a valuable possession, so I sent it by C.I.E. Fastrack and to be really sure, I had the fish collected at Kingsbridge Station and hand delivered to the Irish Specimen Fish Committee Offices on Mobhi Road. I couldn't bear the thought of the fish being delayed, start to smell and be dumped, and the agony of waiting another 30 years would be just too much to bear!

The following year, 1982, and again in Youghal, I caught another specimen flounder - weight 2 lbs. 9 ozs., and yet another fish the same day was just short by a .5 oz. to complete my trio.

On the evening of 17th August, 1983, I was fishing for turbot on Cork Harbour's Turbot Bank, with George Vickery, Chairman, Crosshaven S.A.C., on the boat of the club's vice-president, Charlie Robinson. Fishing had been fair with a few small turbot taken, when I got a solid take. After I struck, I knew a true "rod bender" had been hooked. Helped by a strong flood tide, a fine specimen 25.24 lbs blonde ray fought strongly for all of 30 minutes, before he could be brought to the boat's side.

Within ten minutes, I was again struck in a ferocious tussle with something heavier and stronger, much to the disbelief of my two Crosshaven S.A.C. angling friends. When the "fish" finally surfaced and was landed, they turned out to be a 20 lbs blonde ray on one hook and a 14 pounder on the other, both were slid gently back to the depths of Cork Harbour to grow to specimen size!

So, all you despairing specimen fish hunters, do not give up, as you can see, you might have to wait thirty years for your first specimen fish, but, then as I have discovered, "they come, not in single file, but in battalions", to borrow a phrase from that great English scribe!

# RULES PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

- 1) IRISH SPECIMEN FISH COMMITTEE: This Committee consists of representatives of the Irish Angling Federations and the Government Departments and official organisations interested in angling. Its objective is to verify, record and publicise the capture of large fish on rod and line in Irish waters. A list of Specimen Fish is published annually by the Committee. Only fish which can be fully vouched for as to weight and species can be accepted and listed and listed by the Committee.
- 2) FAIR ANGLING: "Fair Angling" means any legitimate method of angling with rod and reel which is recognised as a fair and sporting method. A fish must be hooked in or in the immediate vicinity of the mouth when it has taken the bait or lure; fish which have been foul-hooked, even accidentally, are not eligible. A fish in respect of which a claim is made must be hooked, played and brought to gaff or net by the angler UNAIDED, though the fish may be gaffed or netted by another, and it is permissible for the person using the gaff to take hold of the trace or doubled line (in the case of big game fishing) to steady the fish when it has been played out and brought within reach. Breakage of rod, reel or line, or alteration or substitution of tackle, while a fish is being played, disqualify it for claim or record purposes. A fish may not be shot, lanced, clubbed or harpooned before landing. Claims for fish caught during the statutory close season for the species (where this applies) cannot be accepted.
- WEIGHING: Fish must be weighed in the presence of independent, reliable witnesses on a properly certified scales, e.g., a shop scales or an official club scales which is covered by a certificate from the local Weights and Measures Officer. Claims cannot be accepted in respect of fish weighed on scales inappropriate to the size of the fish, e.g., fish in the 2 to 5 lb range weighed on balances weighing up to 100 lbs or over and graduated in large divisions. Claims cannot be accepted in the case of fish which has been weighed on board a boat. Please note: Weighing scales must be covered by a Certificate of Accuracy at the time of weighing. They cannot be certified in retrospect, i.e. after the fish has been weighed.
- 4) IDENTIFICATION: The identification of a fish must be fully documented where there is a possibility of its confusion with any other (and particularly larger) species. For this reason, the Committee in respect of some species insists on scales from the fish, close up photographs or the actual body as actual proof of identification before it will consider claims. Scales must be submitted in respect of claims for SALMON, SEA TROUT, BROWN TROUT (including SLOB TROUT). Any brown trout taken in tidal waters, i.e., in the sea or in an estuary below the freshwater boundary as defined for that river will be regarded for claim purposes as a slob trout. About 50 scales scraped from each shoulder of the fish should be sent with the claim. The fish itself should be forwarded for identification to the Irish Specimen Fish Committee, Mobhi Boreen, Glasnevin, Dublin 9, in the case of fish taken in the Republic of Ireland, and to the Fisheries Laboratory, The Cutts, Coleraine, N.I., in the case of fish taken in Northern Ireland. The actual body must be forwarded for identification in the case of the following species: DACE, ROACH, RUDD/BREAM HYBRID,

ROACH/ BREAM HYBRID, MACKEREL, SCAD, HERRING, SHAD, FLOUNDER, DAB, BRILL, MEGRIM, GURNARDS, GREY MULLET, ANGLER FISH, LESSER SPOTTED DOGFISH, THREE BEARDED ROCKLING, SMOOTH HOUND, RAYS BREAM, "RIVER" EELS taken in tidal waters and GARFISH (head and gills only).CLEAR, SHARP, CLOSE-UP PHOTOGRAPHS, showing the entire fish with its fins and other features easily seen, and not fore-shortened or obscured by shadows or bystanders must be provided in the case of TOPE, SHARKS, SKATE, RAY, MONKFISH, POLLACK, COALFISH, BALLAN WRASSE, TRIGGER FISH. If necessary, the fish should be hung up. In the case of skates and rays, photographs of both back and belly surfaces should be provided and particulars of the coloration given (with particular reference to the presence of dark or grey spots, or streaks or patches on the belly side). Samples of the teeth should be furnished in the case of Porbeagle and Mako Sharks. In addition, there should be a clear close-up photograph showing the jaws and teeth exposed.

5) LIMITATION ON NUMBER OF CLAIMS: A maximum of three (3) awards will be made to any particular claimant for a single species in any one year. However, provision will be made that when an angler achieves this target and subsequently captures larger fish, these will be taken into account but the final number of awards for any species in a single year will not be more than three awards. By including this latter provision, it will ensure that the anglers competitive spirit is kept up and higher achievements could still be sought.

#### (6) SENDING FISH TO THE COMMITTEE:

**Please** (1) Notify the Committee when a fish is being sent in for identification (Telephone Dublin 379206).

- (2) Do not forward fish to the Committee before Bank Holidays or weekends; (keep in a cold store or preferably frozen if fish cannot be delivered quickly on or before Friday afternoon).
- (3) Please attach a label to each fish forwarded for identification giving the captor's name and address, date and place of capture and the weight of the fish.
- (4) Fish (except small examples which have been previously soaked in formalin for at least 12 hours) should not be sent in polythene bags or wrapped in aluminium foil as this causes very rapid decomposition. They should be wrapped in greaseproof paper and then in newspaper and brown paper.
- (7) AWARDS: Anglers whose claims have been accepted by the Committee will be awarded special "Merit Badges" in the case of Specimen Fish and Silver Medals in the case of Record Fish. Specimen Fish Certificates will also be issued in respect of all ratified specimen fish, special medals to anglers who have captured ten or more species and special badges are issued each year for fish of exceptional merit though not of record size.
